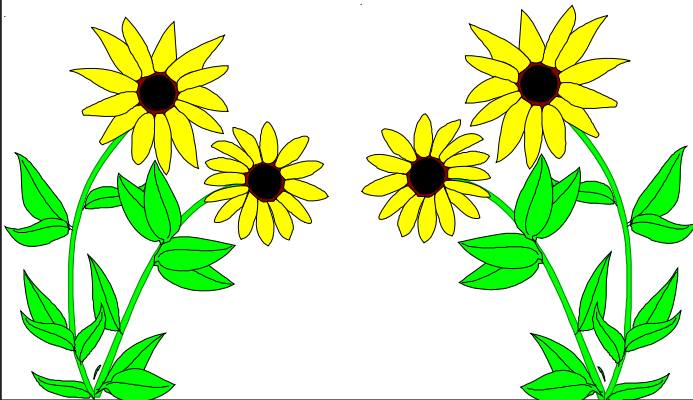
Keep in mind that all equipment is to be cleaned after you have enjoyed its use.

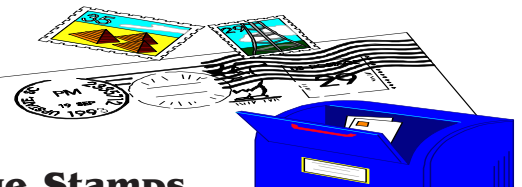

Minutes of Board Meeting

April 7, 2009

President **Bill Schmidt** called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Present were: Treasurer **Barbara (Sue) Hazelden**, Vice President **Peter Palmer**, Corresponding Secretary **Walt Upman**, Recording Secretary **Julia Larson**, Past President **Sue Black**, and directors **Pat Davis**, **Homer Rankhorn** and **Dave Watson**. Also present was **Martha Rankhorn**.

Sue Hazelden gave the treasurer's report, which was discussed by the board, who voted unanimously to accept it. Next year's budget was then presented. Following discussion, this was also approved by unanimous vote. Changing some of the money market funds to a Certificate of Deposit was discussed, and the board agreed to do this at 3rd Federal Bank in St. Petersburg.

Bill Schmidt presented old business, which included the silver room, workshop, recycling, outside and inside contacts. He mentioned the field trip to Rucks mine, of interest to several members. The silver room now has chairs, thanks to a donation from a member's daughter, who also donated some office supplies. There is an overhead projector which can be

used by the club or sold at auction. Some electrical concerns at the clubhouse were discussed, and the board approved contacting electricians for bids. **Dave Watson** is going to make new shop trays to transport rocks, and the board approved this expense, which should be under \$100.

Sue Hazelden mentioned we need an official copy of the bylaws on file at the clubhouse, and also that we need to vote to accept/amend the previous month's minutes at the beginning of each meeting.

The need for a larger meeting space was discussed. **Sue Hazelden and Pat Davis** will investigate other venues and report at the general meeting. The annual banquet was mentioned in connection with this, including the need for a banquet chair ASAP.

Election of new officers will be held at the April 16 meeting. **Sue Black** will handle the installation.

Bill Schmidt currently has all the membership information, since the membership chair is out of town for an extended period. Two new member

families were voted in, **John DiPaola** and his daughter **Nina**; and **Geoff and Rachel Colbert**.

Since we now have a few junior members, the need for junior programs was discussed. These included possible field trips over the summer months.

Sue Black said several dealers had been adamant about keeping the show to three days. Two days would not be worth their time and effort. Other show concerns were discussed, including whether the display cabinets need to be refurbished; and whether the demonstrators were spending enough time talking about the club and our amenities as they were demonstrating.

The board agreed to keep the current clubhouse hours over the summer months. Ongoing classes were also discussed, and will be mentioned at the general meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:10 p.m.

Bill Schmidt is installing wires and switches to upgrade the breezeway. Our 8" slab saw is up and running.
