I have been trying to pull together Auctions to help augment the clubs finances, and as I mentioned in earlier articles, it is a labor intensive task! I have had some amazing help from several members, however, the kind of help I need now is TECHNOLOGICAL! These are the areas where help is needed:

- 1) Someone who is comfortable-knowledgeable with uploading photos to Facebook—LOTS of photos, plus adding descriptions. With that done, we could hold auctions using Facebook.

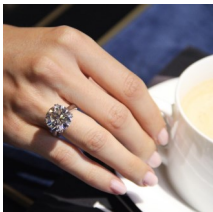
Gem of The Month: Aquamarine



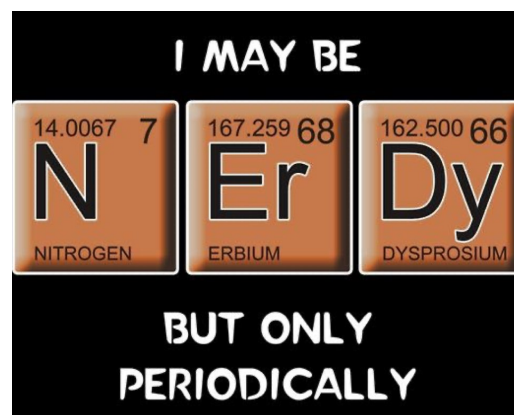
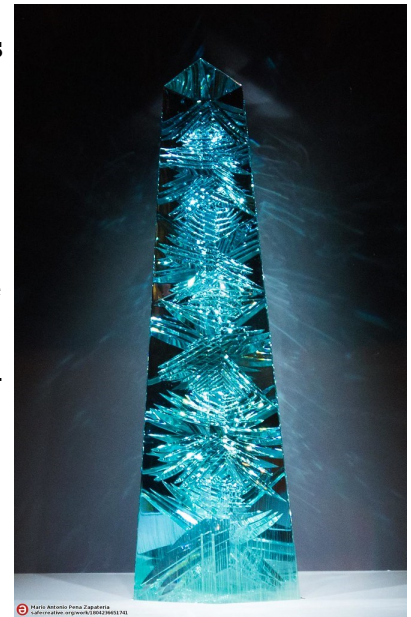
AQUAMARINE comes from the two Latin words for “water” and “sea” and it is no wonder that it was associated with the Roman God Neptune and the folklore that sailors believe it will protect them at sea and bring them home safely. Besides being the March birthstone, it is the gem for the 19th year anniversary.

In 1936, President Getúlio Vargas of Brazil, presented U.S.A. First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt with a 1,298-ct aquamarine gemstone when she and President Franklin D. Roosevelt visited Brazil. The Roosevelt Aquamarine is presently on display at FDR’s Presidential Library in Hyde Park, NY.

The largest cut aquamarine in the world is the Dom Pedro’ which is a faceted column, or obelisk made from a rough crystal that was almost three feet long and weighed close to 100 lbs. The cut stone measures 14 inches by 4 inches wide (at the thicker base) and weighs 10,363 cts. Found in Minas Gerais, in Pedra Azul, Brazil in the 1980s, it was named Dom Pedro after the first two emperors of Brazil, Pedro I and Pedro II. It is on display in the Smithsonian National Museum Hall of Geology.



To understand the size of these famous gems, a one carat Aquamarine would be 6.82 mm and Megan Markle’s aquamarine ring is “only” 30 carats!
